Jesus is about relationships

In a recent article in "Family & Relationships, Health & Medical, Parenting", the headline reads, "American families spend just 37 minutes of quality time together per day." The article written in March of 2018 (pre-COVID) continues, "On weekdays, with parents working and kids at school or in other activities, the time they spend all together doing a common activity is significantly low. While the average family is not even spending 40 minutes together on Monday through Friday, the survey showed that quality time did increase to about 2 hours and 40 minutes on weekend days."
